**Summit on freight charges**

NORTHERN Territory Chief Minister Clare Martin will meet FreightLink chairman Malcolm Kinnaird in Adelaide tomorrow to talk about increased freight charges.

FreightLink has come under fire from transport group Toll Holdings for lifting charges by 15 per cent last month on its Adelaide-Darwin rail service.

Managing director Paul Little said the rise meant Toll would consider changing back to road transport.

A spokeswoman for FreightLink yesterday said the company did not want to make ``any pre-emptive comments'' on a meeting with Ms Martin.

Flinders Ports chief executive Vincent Tremaine said the rail service, which began in January, had had ``very little impact'' on sea freight in the state.

``I think most people in Adelaide are inclined to use Adelaide services,'' he said. ``We can get our services to our customers faster than they can at FreightLink. Why would anyone want to change?''
