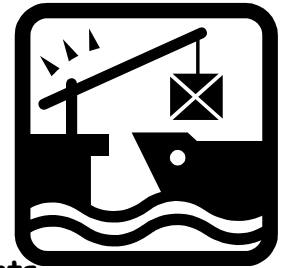

A fantastic way to explore science, technology, mathematics and economics at work.

Enter the world of shipping and discover how cargo is imported and exported in SA. What types of cargo do we import and export? What are the systems and processes used in this work and what are the jobs involved? What impact does shipping have on our every day lives and how has this changed over time?

Spend a day at a working port:-

- ★ Tour the container terminal and be part of the action as giant cranes load containers onto waiting ships and straddle drivers make sure the cargo is kept in order.
- ★ Climb to the top of the signal tower and find out how shipping traffic is monitored as it makes its way in and out of the harbour.
- ★ Solve problems as you load containers onto a model ship ready for its voyage to Indonesia.
- ★ Make decisions as you process a load of cargo through customs.
- ★ Travel back in time at the South Australian Maritime Museum and explore the world of shipping in times gone by.

Cost: \$7 per student (minimum 20 students)
Time: 10.00am - 2.00pm
Venue: Program begins at the Outer Harbour Passenger Terminal and moves onto the DP World Container Terminal and the South Australian Maritime Museum.
Travel: Schools will need to provide a bus to be available throughout the day.
